

REGISTRATION POLICY

Alternative Pathway to Provisional Registration – Practice Ready Assessment

Purpose


The purpose of this policy is to articulate which practice ready assessments are acceptable to the College as an alternative pathway to registration in the provisional class of registration.

Background

Section 2-15 of the College Bylaws under the Health Professions Act states:

Provisional - family

- 2-15 (1) For the purposes of sec tion 20(2) of the Act, to be granted provisional registration for family practice, in addition to the requirements under section 2 17, an applicant must
 - (a) have a medical degree,
 - (b) meet one of the following requirements:
 - (i) if they have completed a family medicine program in Canada after July 1, 2010, but have not obtained certification with the CFPC, they must provide a recommendation from the applicant's Program Director and Chairperson of the Department of Family Medicine, attesting to competence and successful completion of all program requirements, acceptable to the registration committee,
 - (ii) have successfully completed a minimum of two years of accredited postgraduate training in a foreign jurisdiction recognized by the CFPC for the award of certification without
 - (iii) have obtained certification with the American Osteopathic Board of Family Physicians, or
