



Route to Licensure: Fast-Tracked Licensure

Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to outline the eligibility criteria for physicians applying for registration and licensure in the full – family or full –specialty class via the fast-tracked licensure route.

Definitions

home jurisdiction The Canadian province or territory where the physician holds an

active, full, unrestricted licence

receiving jurisdiction The College of Physicians and Surgeons of British Columbia (the

College).

Policy

To be eligible for registration and licensure in the full – family or full – specialty class via the fast-tracked licensure route, an applicant must

- x hold a full, unrestricted licence with the medical regulatory authority in their home jurisdiction
- x provide a certificate of professional conduct from the applicant's home jurisdiction, satisfactory to the receiving jurisdiction, indicating that they have an active, full, unrestricted licence
- x be compliant with continuing professional development (CPD) requirements in the home jurisdiction
- x maintain active registration in their home jurisdiction until the applicant obtains registration and licensure with the College

Applicants for fast- tracked registration and licensure should submit an application via the Application for Medical Registration in Canada (AMRC) portal.
